

LIFE and Mr. Holland's Opus Donate \$25K in New Instruments to Louisville Middle School

Through the incredible efforts of all LIFE Members who participated in the 'Kids Need Music' program that we held last year (remember those orange wrist bands we were selling?) The Mr. Holland's Opus Foundation (MHOF), a non-profit organization that supports music education programs in schools nationwide, surprised students at the Farnsley Middle School in Louisville, KY with the donation of \$25,000 worth of instruments to the school's music program.

You might remember that the funds LIFE Members raised were in support of Mr. Holland's Opus Foundation. It was our way of 'bridging the generation

in the 'surprise'. gap' and giving younger music fans the opportunity to enjoy and play music in the same way that we do as music makers.

Farnsley Middle School serves 1,100 6th through 8th grade students in the Louisville area. Over 300 music students at the school took part in the unveiling during early morning classes. Farnsley's current school music program budget is \$5500 a year for both orchestra and band, so the donation came as a well-needed boost to the music program and the students.

It was Ralph who built the infamous 'Sugar Shack' that was housed at their local Kmart during a BBQ fundraiser the group held.

Notes From 'The Professor'



Hello fellow L.I.F.E. Members. Thought I'd talk about your wonderful black Lowrey song book that came with your Lowrey. The LC, LX, SE and SU models play some or all of the songs from this book.

All of these songs, with their great arrangements, were recorded

by Lowrey artist, **Bil Curry**. Each one is a masterpiece! (Of course, we don't tell him that... LOL!)

The smaller models have these songs recorded internally in the organ. The larger models have these songs on a disk(s). This wonderful Lowrev feature gives you three great benefits:

- 1. Listening to these songs for entertainment value. Find out how to "chain" these songs to automatically go from one song to another. This enhances the value of your investment.
- 2. Let this feature teach you how to play any or all of the songs available on your model. (Remember, not all models have all 50 songs). Some mid-size to larger models have a "Play Along" feature which allows you to do just that - play along with Bil.
- 3. In most cases, as any of these songs are playing, you can capture or "memorize" the registrations for you own use. Find out if your model activates the Karaoke feature.

I realize this is only a broad picture, but I hope it will encourage you to explore the capabilities of your particular model with regard to this ability!

The Points

JULY DOUBLE POINTS:

Volunteer Activity

Typical volunteer activities can range from donating time, food, toys and materials, to organizational help, as well as helping raise funds. You can claim points for Volunteer efforts all year long for any local or national charity your Chapter chooses to volunteer for. Normal Points are 500. Double Points are 1000.

RULES and RESTRICTIONS:

Only Members who participate in the event or volunteer receive 1000 points for each event.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

A Volunteer Activity is NOT CONSID-ERED 'MAKING MUSIC IN YOUR **COMMUNITY'.** A Volunteer Activity is when you help others in your community that doesn't involve playing at a senior center, nursing home, etc. Those activities are considered 'Making Music In Your Community'. Only if you hold a fundraiser concert will playing for others be considered a Volunteer Activity.

AUGUST DOUBLE POINTS:

Brina A Friend To Class

When you bring a friend to your classes, you're introducing your friend to a great hobby and you should be rewarded for it. Normal Points are 3000. Double Points are 6000.

RULES and RESTRICTIONS:

One new friend, per class. Members cannot claim points for bringing the same friend to class each week, or on different months. Qualifying friends may not have ever been enrolled in Lowrev classes before and may not have ever been a member of LIFE. To receive points, Members must write in the name of the friend they brought to class on the **Activity Award Authorization Form.**
