Attach The Music Rack

Insert the legs of the Music Rack into the holes located on the top of the instrument cabinet.

- -Take care not to scratch the top of the cabinet.
- -Avoid applying excessive force when attaching / removing the Music Rack.

Attach the AC Power Adapter

- 1. Connect the AC power cable to the DC IN jack on the back of the instrument.
- 2. Connect the AC power cord to the AC Power Adapter.
- 3. Connect the AC power cord into an AC wall outlet.

Volumes

Control the overall volume level and add expression with your right foot while playing using the **Expression Pedal**.





Bass controls the volume of the Bass sound in a Music Style and the Auto Bass when using EASY. Press to increase the **Bass** Volume. The display illustrates the volume level.



Press to decrease the **Bass** Volume.





Accomp. controls the volume of instruments in a Music Style and the Lower Sounds volume.

Press to increase the $\ensuremath{\textbf{Accomp.}}$ Volume.

The display illustrates the volume level.







Drum Volume controls the volume of the drums / percussion instruments in a Music Style. Press to increase the **Drum** Volume. The display illustrates the volume level.



EASY Play

ABC's Each key on the EZ3 is clearly labeled to match the music in the Lowrey Song Book and Lowrey Magic class books. Follow the music and match the notes with the keys.





Activate Lowrey Easy-Play features by pressing **EASY**.

• EASY Play Chords - Full-sounding, musically correct chords with one finger.

• Chord Memory - Chord keeps playing even after you release the key(s)

• **Auto Bass** - Plays a rich-sounding bass along with you automatically.

EASY Play Chords

EASY Play Chords become active when you press the Easy button or select a Music Style.

The Red, Blue, and Green Chord Lights above the

keyboard become illuminated.

These lights match the color-coded bars printed in Lowrey music.

Selecting a Style *Full Band*



Style Setup



Style Setup provides a complete sound setup for the active Music Style.

-Use the Setup as is, or...

-Select different sounds, or...

-Turn Style Setup off and select your own sounds.

-Use the Song Setup feature



Song Setup provides 100 complete setups, including a Music Style, inspired by certain song titles. -Song titles are listed in the back of this guide.

Once a Style is Selected...

Start/Stop and Easy become active. The Keyboard splits.





- Play your melody notes (ABC's) on the Right Hand/Upper Keyboard.

- Play your accompaniment chords (Red, Blue, Green) on the Left Hand/Lower Keyboard. (The keyboard also splits when **EASY** or Left-Organs/More is active.)

Style Setup becomes active.

To begin a Style is playing...



Play any Left Hand/Lower Keyboard chord (conventional or MCS).
Or press Start Stop.

Start / Stop

Use Start Stop to start and stop a Music Style ...

- Temporarily pause a **Music Style** without changing the setup.
- Play a left hand chord or press **Start Stop** again and the **Music Style** starts playing again on the downbeat (first beat of a measure).

Add an Introduction to a Style





Press Intro Ending to add an Introduction, matched to the selected Music Style, to your song.

Feature (Clear)



Press **Feature** -Off- to see the display count down the **Introduction** and give a cue when to begin to play.

Play the first Left Hand/Lower Keyboard chord of your song; conventional or EASY Play chords. *The Music Style's Introduction will begin to play.*





- Begin playing your song when the introduction is through and the Style is playing.

Minor Chord Introduction

Hear a different introduction to the **Music Style** when playing a Left Hand/Lower Keyboard minor chord to begin the song.



- Play a Minor Chord, conventional or MCS, to begin the Style playing.



With **EASY** active play **F** and A_{\flat} to play the **F** minor chord.

Add an Ending to a Style

To hear a professional sounding Ending when you are finished playing your song...

- Lift your left hand off of the keys
- Press the Intro Ending button.

The **Tempo** for each **Music Style** is preset.

- To decrease or increase the **Tempo** press the up or down buttons.
- The value of the **Tempo** can be seen in the **Displa**y along with the Left Hand/Lower Keyboard chord being played.





- Press both **Tempo** buttons to lock the current tempo setting.





- Unlock Tempo by pressing a Tempo button.



Downbeat

The **Downbeat Indicator** illustrates the **Tempo** of a **Music Style.**

Red indicates the **Downbeat** of the **Music Style** - the first beat of a measure.

Fill adds a rhythmic break to any Music Style when the style is playing.Simply press Fill while a Style is playing.

Use **Fill** between sections of a song (Verse to Chorus) or whenever you feel like adding a break.

Press and hold Fill for different lengths of time to hear different variations.

Selecting a Sound



Combine Organs and Orchestral Sounds

Combine any organ sound with any Orchestral sound.









Dual Sounds

Combine any two Orchestral sounds. For example, Piano & Strings.



Piano Keyboard



With no LEFT - Organs/More, Music Style or EASY active the keyboard does not split.



Play Organ, Orchestral and combined organ and Orchestral sounds on the entire keyboard.







Add either the **Glide** or the **Sustain** effect to Orchestral sounds. The effect is applied according to whether the actual acoustic instrument naturally glides or sustains.

To Glide - For example, Guitars can Glide.



-Press and hold the Left Foot Switch.

- -Play and hold the note(s).
- -Release the Left Foot Switch. The notes(s) will Glide.

To Sustain - For example, Pianos can sustain.







-Play the note(s).

- -Press and hold the Left Foot Switch.
- -Release the key(s) played and the notes will sustain.
- -Release the Left Foot Switch.

Orch Octave - Control the pitch of **Orchestral** sounds so they sound good to you no matter where on the keyboard they are played.







Touch - Turn the keyboard Touch Sensitivity Off or On. (Power On setting is ON.)

Assembling the EZ3 Bench

- 1. Place the seat upside down on a flat surface taking care not to scratch the surface of the seat.
- 2. Place one of the side panels against the mounting bracket on the seat making sure the mounting holes align. Fasten the side panel to the seat bracket using two bolts. Do not yet fully tighten the bolts.
- 3. Repeat step 2 for the other side panel. Again, do not fully tighten the bolts.
- 4. Slip the bench cross support between the side panels making sure the mounting holes align on one side. Fasten the cross support to the side panel using two bolts. Do not fully tighten the bolts.
- 5. Repeat step 4 for the other side.
- 6. Once both side panels and the cross support are fastened together carefully stand the bench upright.

Firmly tighten all eight bolts.

Please follow these instructions carefully and completely for your safety and comfort. A poorly assembled bench can cause injury.

CAUTION:

- 1. Do not use the bench for any purpose other than its intended use as the EZ3 bench.
- 2. Only one person at a time may sit on the bench.
- 3. Be sure all bolts are firmly tightened during the final stage of assembly.
- 4. Be sure to immediately retighten any bolts that may loosen over time.
